## 6m Blocks

- 2 trainees at any one time.
- Mixture of General and Obstetric on call
- Staggered starts: Aug/Nov/Feb/May

## Paeds:

- Two 6m posts per year: August and February starts
- On call at RHC

## **3m Senior DGH Block**

- Only if trainee undertakes 12m Advanced General training:
  - o Includes trainees doing: Vascular, Regional, Airway, POM
  - Excludes trainees doing some specialty on call: AOAT, Paeds, ICM, EMRS
  - Must do at least 3m Genera/General at base
- Available at all sites except IRH and FVR
- Trainees can select preferred DGH (or back up, if preferred not available for dates)
- One senior trainee at a time, in any particular DGH
- Duty 2/Senior on call, between resident trainee(s) and consultants(s)
- Base CTs to organise/liaise with DGH CTs and then confirm arrangements with the TPD
- Monklands: Advanced Airway/MaxFax is a **CUT form option** within this DGH block
- Lanarkshire (either Wishaw, Hairmyres or Monklands): POM is a **CUT form option** within this DGH block, when combined with 3m General/General at base (sufficient capacity for one trainee to gather Advanced POM competencies within Lanarkshire, at any one time)

## **Overall Balance of Advanced Training**

Several patterns possible: 1 x 12m, 2 x 6m, 6m + 3m + 3m, 9m + 3m.

Standard advanced general training block duration can be 3, 6, 9 or 12m.

To ensure equity of opportunities, trainees are limited to two blocks outside of standard general training, so it is not possible to complete 3m + 3m + 3m + 3m. In addition, trainees should not repeat an airway, regional or vascular block (unless spare capacity available after appointments concluded).

If 6m of advanced training has reduced anaesthetic activity (e.g. Academic, ICM or EMRS), remaining advanced 6m must be entirely adult anaesthetic practice.

If not undertaking 12m advanced sub-specialty post, trainees must complete at least 3m standard advanced general training ('General/General').

# Advanced training 12m plans are coordinated by the College Tutors, in discussion with the Deputy Regional Advisers. Prospective approval is then required from the TPD.
